### More waste sorting

Your building has received a new cabinet for hazardous waste. This way more waste can be recycled correctly.



## What is hazardous waste?

Here are some of your typical household items which must be disposed of in the cabinet for hazardous waste. These items could be:

- + Yes
- + Spray cans
- + Chemical bottles
- + Left-over-paint
- + Small electronic items
- + Light bulbs (in plastic bags)
- + Batteries (in plastic bags)

- ÷ No
- + Fireworks
- ÷ Ammunition
- + Left-over medicine
- ÷ Gas canisters
- Needles

## How to empty the cabinet

The cabinet will be emptied by waste collectors at set intervals.

The boxes in the cabinet will be emptied and exchanged for empty boxes.

#### How to use the cabinet

The cabinet is child-proof and can only be opened by pressing the pushbuttons and turning the handle.

The cabinet contains red boxes in which you can dispose of your hazardous waste. Please close the cabinet when you are done using it.

# Why is the waste hazardous?

There are several reasons as to why some waste can be hazardous. For example, the waste can be:

- Flammable
- A health hazard
- Environmentally hazardous

When you sort your hazardous waste, you help taking care of our collective health and environment, while ensuring that we recycle as much as possible.



When disposing chemicals, make sure that the liquids are in the original container. The container must be sealed with a lid and placed upright.

### Do you have larger quantities of hazardous waste?

Hazardous waste in large quantities or in large containers (larger than 10 litres) must be handed in at the recycling station.
